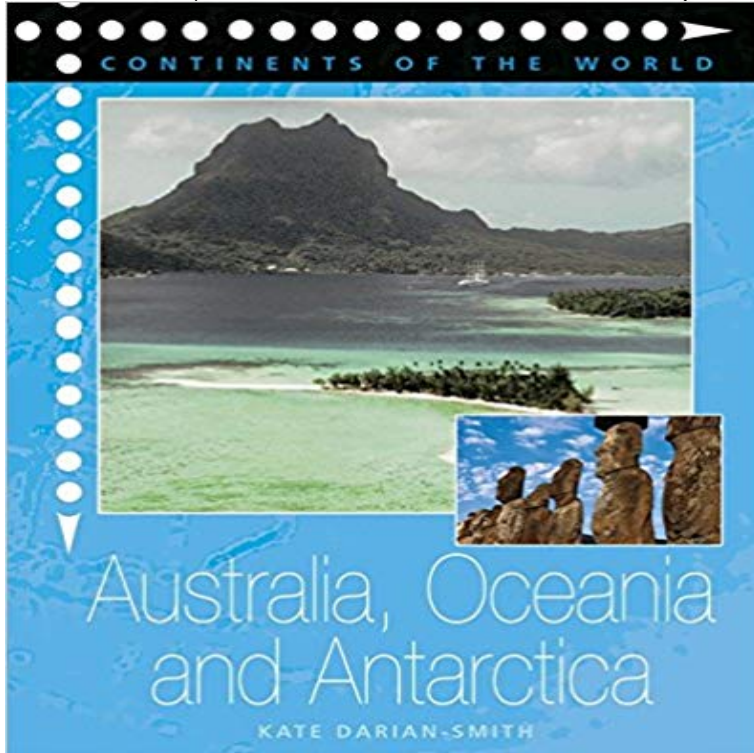


Australia, Oceania and Antarctica (Continents of the World)
