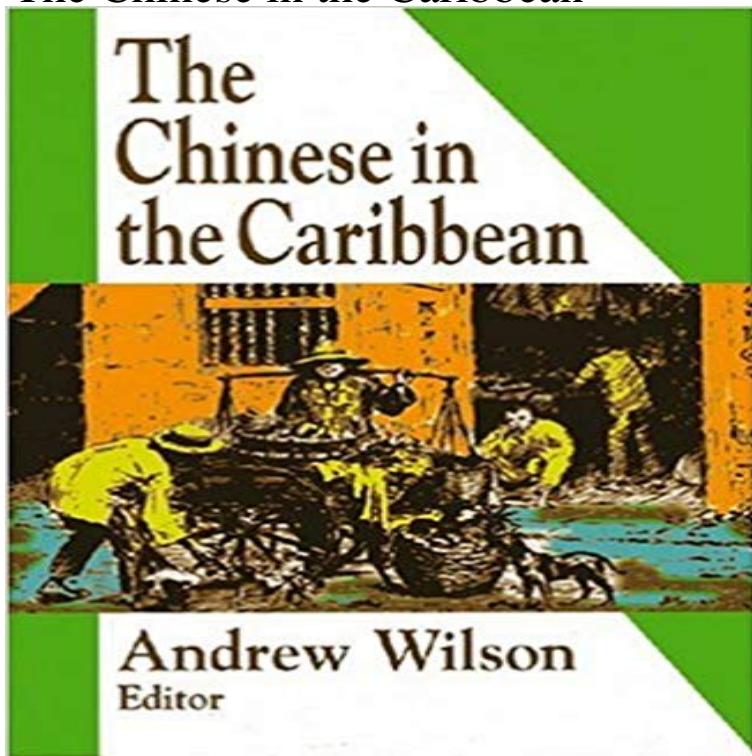


## The Chinese in the Caribbean
