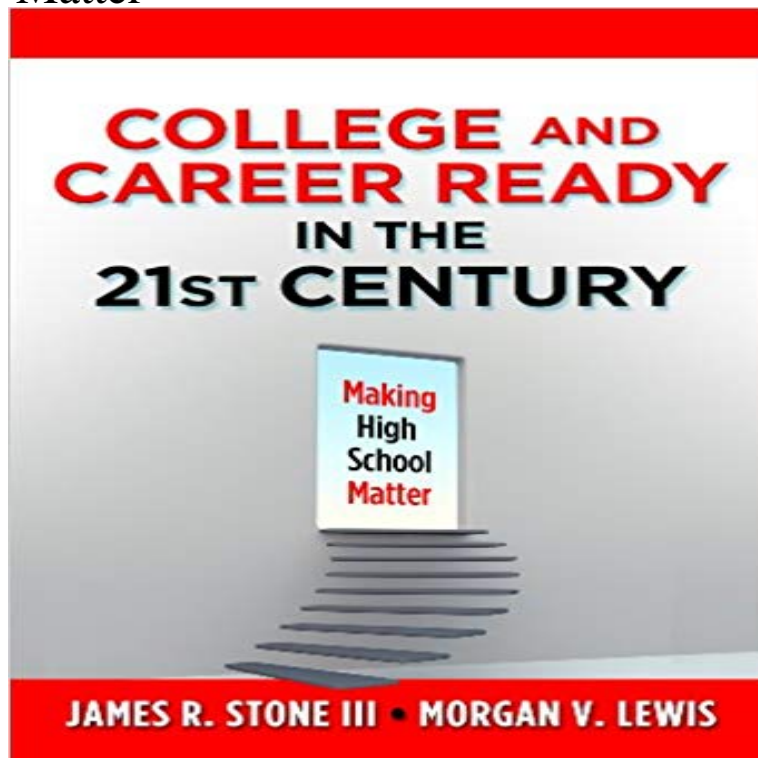


## College and Career Ready in the 21st Century: Making High School Matter
