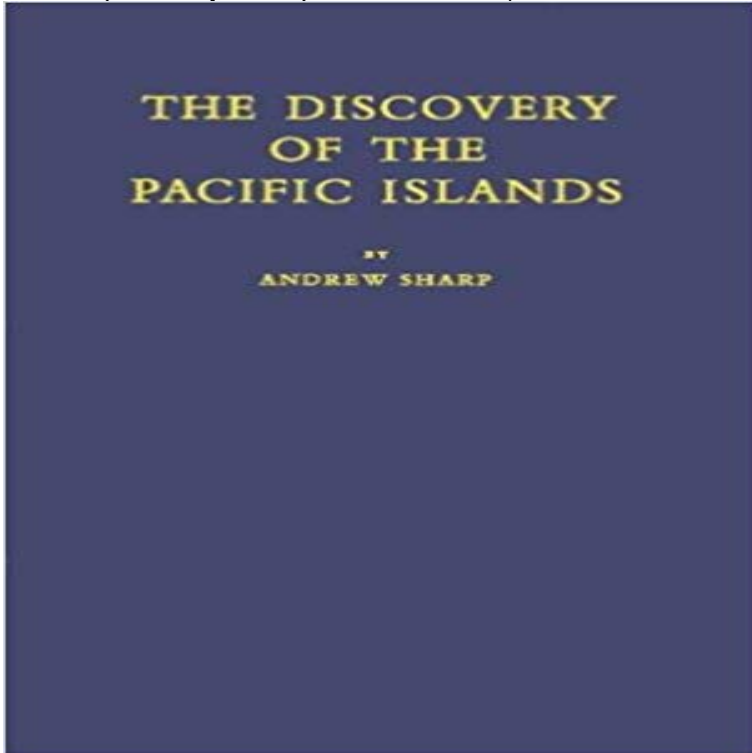


The (European) Discovery of the Pacific Islands
