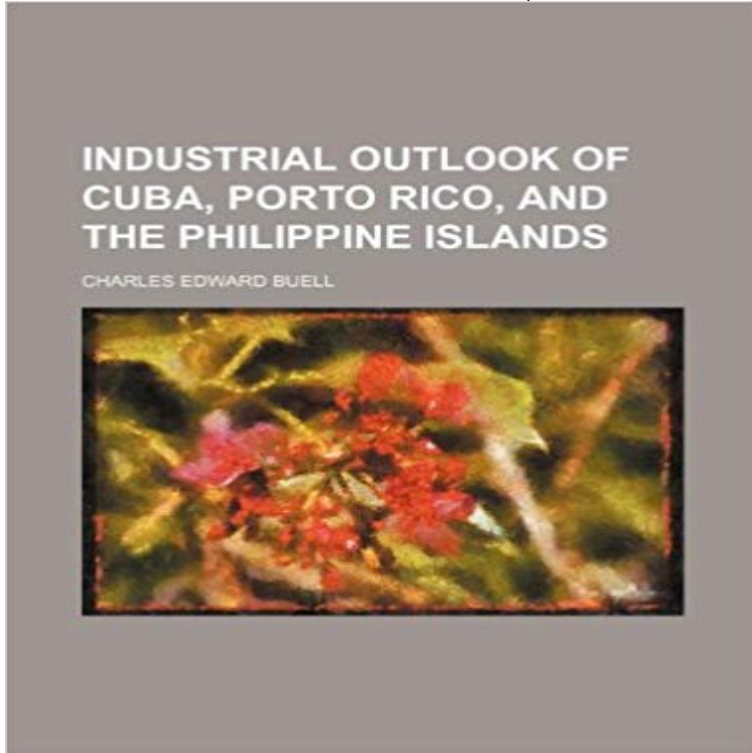


Industrial outlook of Cuba, Porto Rico, and the Philippine Islands

At the time of their removal these Indians were in poverty, but they became thrifty, and have long since acquired all the elements of genuine prosperity; schools, a college in their own language, newspapers, and a deposited school fund of more than a million dollars. It is stated that these now civilized Indians have a wealth that can be safely set at \$17,000 for each head of family. During all the years that have elapsed since they were aided, they have repaid over and over again the outlay, by the revenues received by the Government from their being thus settled. Contrast this policy with that pursued towards the Seminoles. Some one urged a less amount for their removal than had been provided for the Cherokees, and they declined it. A desolating war ensued which cost the tax-payers \$10,000,000, and resulted in the killing of 1,466 white men. System will accomplish more than disorder, and the Government can by systematizing the manner of production and distribution in Porto Rico, bring a great prosperity to its people. If the people of the acquired islands are to be left to fight the battle of life as single handed workers, under no more favorable conditions than were present when Spain had rule, the people will be the losers by the change. If foreign capital controls the industry of the islands it will influence every legal enactment so that the labor of the islands will bear all the burdens, and our Government will be at an expense to

protect foreign capital that, in turn, will gather all the net gains and send...
